Because it has now been one year since you chose me to serve in the office of President of the Florida-Bahamas Synodical Women's Organization, I thought "annals" would be appropriate.

The theme of our Fall Gathering certainly was well suited to summarize the past year for me. Step by Step: "We can make our plans, but the Lord determines our steps." Beginning in January, my plans for our annual executive board and conference leaders' meeting at Luther Springs had to be switched to Zoom format at the last minute because of a surge in the Omicron variant of Covid. So instead of the time to worship together, conduct our business meetings, plan Spring Gatherings, and get acquainted in casual hours on the porch at Luther Springs, we saw each other in the tiny squares on our screens and did the necessary work. The quick pivot to Zoom for the leadership meeting did not allow time for Conference Leaders to plan their Spring Gatherings, but the Lord provided each conference with a theme suitable for them. Their meetings were individually crafted to suit them and were held as local conditions shifted to allow safe meetings.

Our Churchwide Organization also had to adjust to conditions shaped by shifting levels of viral infection around the nation. The staff of Churchwide learned how to meet the needs of church units efficiently using new technology skills. Interactive programs and workshops were available live on Zoom, and replays are still available on www.womenoftheelca.org. The staff is available by phone or email to handle individual questions or requests for service. As new leaders of church units, conferences, and our synod take office, I urge you to go to the website and watch the one hour workshops for the office you have been elected to. While you're there, check out some of the other resources available free for us to download.

As the year came closer to the end, it was hard for me not to think of all the things I would do if I weren't elected SWO President at Fall Gathering. But my steps were again determined by God to have the privilege of serving again.



Reflections from Justice and Advocacy

Throughout my last two years on the board, I have been assigned "justice and advocacy" as my area of focus. Throughout those two years, I have written many articles relating to justice and advocacy, including Black Lives

Matter and LGBTQ+ issues.

How fitting, then, that it was my simple act of wearing a t-shirt that has brought LGBTQ+ issues to the forefront of the Florida-Bahamas Women of the ELCA and created an opportunity for our organization to find a new meeting place for future fall gatherings. Here is how it transpired.

I arrived on Thursday to help prepare for the gathering and to attend our board meeting. On Friday morning, I was busily moving around Lake Yale Retreat Center, which is managed by the Southern Baptist Convention, doing errands and interacting with



office staff numerous times. I also happened to be wearing a pride shirt (*pictured here*). The shirt was actually very subtle, with a rainbow flag that had the outline of Florida and the message "*Pride Lives Here*." When getting dressed that morning, I didn't think twice about it. The office staff apparently did, and a few hours later they called *Anne Storan* and *Tracy Moffat* to the office. They were told that my shirt had prompted them to look at our website (https://www.flwelca.com), as well as the Florida-Bahama Synod's website (https://fbsynod.com). From these websites, they realized that we are part of *Reconciling Works* (https://www.reconcilingworks.org/) and include and support the LGBTQ+ community in our organizations and churches. We were then informed that any group from the Florida-Bahamas Synod would not be welcome at Lake Yale in the future, as supporting LGBTQ+ people and rights violated their "core values." We would be allowed to stay for the weekend, but I needed to change my shirt.

Now, I'm going to be honest - I REALLY didn't want to change my shirt. I wanted to wear it loud and proud as a way to fight for justice. In fact, I also wanted to go out and get rainbow ribbons for everyone to wear. However, I also realized that Lake Yale would send all of us home on Friday, and it wouldn't change any minds, nor would it provide justice to our LGBTQ+ members. So I went back to my room, changed my shirt (but kept my rainbow earrings on), and began to write a resolution to bring to the voting members. This resolution passed unanimously (see page 7). We also booked the same weekend next year at the Methodist retreat center 20 minutes away from Lake Yale.

Thinking back on the weekend, I am glad I wore the shirt. While our support of *Reconciling Works* is contrary to the Southern Baptists Convention's core values, their discrimination and marginalization of LGBTQ+ people is against OUR core values, and it is time to move to a different place that has similar values. I appreciate all of the years and wonderful memories we have had at Lake Yale, but I look forward to creating new memories next year at the *Warren Willis Camp*.

I am so proud to be a member of our organization and the ELCA, and this just shows how much work there is to be done. Here is the text of the resolution that passed unanimously:

Title: Affirmation of God's love for all people

Whereas Christ's greatest commandment is to love thy neighbor;

Whereas Christ lifted up the marginalized and ate with the outcasts;

Whereas the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has affirmed their support of Reconciling Works;

Whereas the Florida-Bahamas synod is a Reconciling Works synod;

Whereas LGBTQ+ community members have often been mistreated;

Whereas Florida state law 1557 has limited the rights of LGBTQ+ students and teachers in Florida;

Therefore be it resolved that we affirm our support for our LGBTQ+ siblings and pledge to actively work against discrimination, while advocating for justice for all;

Therefore be it further resolved that we encourage our Churchwide organization to provide resources to help us in our walk alongside the LGBTQ+ community.

Gather magazine Winter/Spring 2023 Bible study "The Ten Commandments"

So more can receive God's Word—a ministry for the deaf

Lori Fuller is the newly ordained pastor of **Palms Deaf Church**, a new ministry in Palm Coast, Fla., for people who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing. Lori is the third person who is Deaf to be ordained in the Lutheran church worldwide.

Lori grew up not knowing who God was, due to a lack of access to church. She communicates through American Sign Language (ASL), and never had an interpreter or anyone who could sign at church services. It was not until she met a man, *Curtis*, who later became her husband, that she finally was able to have access. He is hearing and signs fluently. He was involved in a Deaf ministry in Wisconsin called, "Hands of Christ Deaf Ministry" which was led by *Pastor Gisele Berninghaus*. Once she became involved in the Deaf ministry, she finally understood that she was a beloved child of God, and it has transformed her life.

Lori and her family moved from Wisconsin to Florida in 2005. She tried to find a Deaf ministry here, but there were none. After many years of working in the State of Florida as a Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, she realized the Deaf community was seeking more in their lives. In addition, they have three adopted children (two are Deaf) and wanted them to have the same experience that she did in Wisconsin with, "Hands of Christ Deaf

Ministry." She felt the gentle nudges of God calling her to ministry, and started seminary at Luther Seminary in 2019.

A dedicated ministry for Deaf people is desperately needed as 95% of Deaf people are unchurched, mostly because of a lack of access to an ASL church or spiritual care. Unlike hearing people, who can walk into any neighborhood church and get what they needed, it was not so for the Deaf community. It is almost unheard of to find a pastor who is Deaf, so most people look for churches who have a sign language interpreter. Church who offer such a service are often difficult to find. And even when an interpreter is available, it is not exactly full access. Typically an interpreter is only available for a single Sunday service. If the person wants to participate in the day-to-day life of the church, small group or even fellowship, interpreters are usually not available for these activities.

Palms Deaf Church wants to change this and to be a tool to help Deaf people feel God's presence and love. Palms Deaf Church will be inclusive of the Deaf in the full life of the congregation so they can participate in the full experience of what coming together as a community focused on Christ can mean. I was blessed in a recent chat with my daughter who shared some words of wisdom that I sorely needed. With all that has recently transpired, I was feeling not up to par and very "behind" in the scheme of things.
