Anne's Advice



My final year as your Florida-Bahamas SWO President has brought me unexpected joy and thought-provoking conversations in time spent with our community of women. I was blessed to be present at four of our Spring Gatherings this year. I shared in all of their unique worship services, singing, Bible studies, community service, and election of conference officers. During informal conversation and intentional listening sessions, I heard the women's shared satisfaction of serving the church, the society, and the world through food banks, winter shelters, clothing distribution, quilts, and personal care kits. But I also heard concerns about declining participation. I heard worried comments about lack of unity in their families, their churches, and the nation. They thought that people were too busy with individual pursuits and personal achievements. They admitted that at times it was difficult to resume activities they used to enjoy. It is harder to prioritize relationships, community, and unity.

Perhaps in the future WELCA will need to include more than a lifetime commitment to Lutheran World Relief quilts, more than a monthly "Gather" Bible study on Thursday afternoon at 1:00 PM. Maybe more variety and flexibility would create new opportunities and raise interest. We need to make a commitment to being open to new relationships to be able to learn how to serve new women through living the Purpose and Mission of WELCA.

Churchwide WELCA held a Zoom leadership event in May. I recommend that you watch this event by visiting <u>WELCA.org</u> and scrolling down to *Servant Leader: Present, Equipped, Here.* In this session, you will learn to appreciate a deeper connection to the various communities you are a member in. Each member belongs to the others as they act as the body of Christ. Servant leadership in the community involves recognizing the value of your gifts and discerning how that shapes your unique role in the community. We are all called to live our gifts at our baptism. Each of us is already equipped to fulfill our role as a leader in our community.

I have faith that if we continue to look to our Mission and Purpose to determine future activity; if we use our gifts with humility; and ask God for guidance, Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will continue to be a leader-full community long into the future.

Let Your Light Shine provides a "helping hand" for our Youth and operates just like Share the Spirit but is designed for Grade 6 through college ladies who would like to attend. If you know any young ladies, invite them to attend and take advantage of this grant if needed. Our Youth Shepherd is busy making plans for the youth activities all weekend!

Grants are awarded to supplement the cost of accommodations, meals, and registration fees. Previous grant recipients are eligible to apply. Both applications are now available: www.flwelca.com on the Fall Gathering page. Include this form with your registration. Again, a reminder that for both grants, applicants are encouraged to also seek support from their congregation, sponsors, and self to share the costs. This will help spread the funds to more women and youth who need assistance to attend. 


FLAGLER/VOLUSIA CONFERENCE

Following a prelude by *Bill Drake, Pastor Reverend Randy Kennedy* welcomed us, gave announcements, and worship service began. The message, "Nourish your child's spirit with His spirit," was given by seminary student, *Maya Pinhassian*. Reverend Kennedy continued with the liturgy and communion.

The business meeting began with reading the minutes of conference meetings in 2023 by Space Coast Conference Secretary *Janet Jodoin. Space Coast Conference President Gisela Khail* introduced me and I invited everyone to the Fall Gathering at Warren Willis Camp and Conference Center. Space Coast is responsible for Registration at Fall Gathering. I encouraged everyone to prayerfully consider using their gifts by filling out a nomination form to serve on the SWO Board. I explained the importance of our Webmaster and the need for someone to volunteer to serve in that volunteer position.

Gisela reported that the officers were all eligible and willing to serve another two-year term. She asked if there were nominations from the floor. There being none, the officers were elected. Most compelling is the number of children who are not only without shelter, but also without parents. Chrystal shared her faith that God will be faithful in showing her solutions and giving her strength to respond to needs. The women of Space Coast Conference demonstrated their commitment to support for GraceWay Village by generously donating 210 pounds of food at their Spring Gathering.

Our Bible study, based on the theme, "Peace, Be Not Anxious," was led by **Dorothy Tate**. She shared a guide to learning how to put your trust in God. She drew the thoughts from *Life Meets Theology* by Dr. Joel Dorman. She used the acronym S.I.P.S. to create a system to find Peace by trusting God. "S" is for Sing. Worship God with music. "I" is for Investigate. Read the Bible. "P" is for Pray. Talk to God, praise him in prayer, thank him for blessings. "S" is for Stay. Stay close to God, persist in your faith, and don't just turn to him when you're in trouble. Following these steps will help you have peace by learning to truly trust God. Conference Secretary Janet Jodoin gave the final statistics. Conference President Gisela Khail gave closing thoughts and closed with a prayer.



AS LUTHERANS ARE WE CALLED TO BE POLITICAL?

On the WELCA.ORG website under resources, there is an article titled "Called to be Political." This article begins "Like it or not, Christians are called to be political. Fears or questions about our church's involvement in politics may reflect a misunderstanding of how Christians, and

especially Lutheran Christians, are called to participate in the political arena." Let's briefly explore this charge before you cast your next vote.

Before you vote for a candidate, please ask yourself if this candidate's policies will hurt or cause harm to a sister in Christ. Does this candidate promote racism, sexism, homophobia, hate or any of the other ills we should be wary of. No matter your personal stance on abortion, will this candidate cut off life saving measures for a pregnant woman? Do you want a candidate who will put your loved ones at risk because of their personal feelings? Do you want a non-medical professional making medical decisions for your daughter, niece, daughter in law, cousin or you?

Before you vote for a candidate, ask yourself if this candidate is someone with empathy or concern for the welfare of others? Recently Florida House Bill 433 was signed. This bill prohibits local governments from requiring employers of outdoor workers to provide water breaks, shade

or opportunities to cool down. HB 433 eliminated the opportunity for municipalities to offer preference to employers who provided this humanitarian treatment to their employees. Instead, employees especially agricultural employees picking fruit, working in fields, etc. are denied this basic human treatment that none of us would deny someone we love. Is this something you support? Is this a policy that reflects your conscience?

No matter how you feel about the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex and/or asexual (LGBTQIA) community, we are brothers and sisters in Christ and in life. Almost every family has a family member who fits into the LGBTQIA+ category. That family member may be too afraid to come out to you, but it is still their life. Do you back candidates who promote harm, promote denial of employment, education, opportunity because of who they love?

Matthew 22:39 says to love one another as we love ourselves. Does your candidate promote inclusion or hate? The ELCA says we love all. Does your candidate?

I'm not asking you to stand up and denounce a candidate or a family member or friend who supports candidates who support and preach hate. If you can't or won't, then quietly go into the voting booth and select candidates that aren't promoting policies to hurt your sisters and brothers in Christ. Vote for candidates that you can say, "I voted to protect you," "I voted to love you," "I voted to give you not only equality but equity." I voted for love and integrity, for all my brothers and sisters in Christ. As Lutherans, as Christians, we ARE called to be political.

Finding Hope in a Complex World

April 17 and 24, 2024 Zoom Workshops

On two Wednesday evenings in April I joined the first ever virtual workshops for women hosted by the Global Mission Table. More than thirty women from Suriname, Guyana, and the Florida-Bahamas synod gathered online to worship and reflect on the topic "Finding Hope in a Complex World." *Rev. Katie Carroll* opened the meeting and welcomed each of us. She reminded us that in Spanish "waiting" and "hoping" are the same word.



Worship on April 17 included Psalm 130:5-6:

I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning.

We also read Romans 5:1-5:

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast of our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Sister Kurtzious from Guyana shared how we find hope in our faith and in serving our community. Sister Nellie Braun spoke of recalling past times of God's faithfulness leading to a good outcome. Elocia Smith from ELCG closed our worship by leading us in singing, "I the God of Sea and Sky."

Following worship, *Rev. Kathryn Carroll, Chair, Global Mission Table Florida-Bahamas Synod*, suggested four questions for our consideration during our discussion time. The technology assistant, *Megan Valle*, broke us into chat rooms with 5 or 6 participants. The women in each chat room engaged in lively discussions. We acknowledged that regardless of our location, we had all experienced ongoing disruptions in our community life.

On April 24, we continued our discussion on "Finding Hope in a Complex World." Once again our conversation was focused on Psalm 130:5-6 and Romans 5:1-5. The centerpiece of this session was a presentation by **Manon Sanchez, PhD**, on the topic "Impact of Domestic Violence on Children." We heard that domestic violence occurs everywhere. It is found in all cultures, in all countries, in all income levels. Dr. Sanchez explained that domestic violence inflicts damage on the body, spirit, and mind of the victim. Times of stress often increase the frequency and intensity of the violence.

In our chat rooms, we were guided to discuss actions that we could take to reduce the likelihood of violence occurring, ways to help victims heal from the damage, and assistance with building a future life free from violence.

We returned from the chat rooms and shared details of our discussions. Before praying "The Lord's Prayer" together, we all agreed that these two sessions had been a blessing and we were hopeful we could come together again soon.
