I have been disappointed that I have not done better.

Isaiah 40:31 says:

but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

The phrase, 'to wait on Yahweh,' means to wait for his help; that is, to trust in him, to put our hope or confidence in him.

I realize that Easter will come, regardless of what I accomplish in Lent. I can always work on these goals. I can trust that God is in control. I can put my hope and confidence in him.

Forms, Funds and Finances...

Greetings SWO Sisters,

Once again it is the time of year when many new Conference and Unit Leaders are being elected so I thought I would take a minute to review the Offerings Forms and such for all the new "money-handlers" out there!

For Spring Gathering, use **Event Data Collection Form** to remit offerings to me. You will also report Conference Leaders on this form. Please send the Conference Officers Update even if no changes are made - we want to always be sure we have correct contact information for everyone.

For regular offerings to the SWO, use **Form A** and send directly to me. These would be offerings such as unit offerings, conference offerings, Love Offerings, and Scholarship Fund Contributions. **These also include donations to the Lutheran World Relief Shipping Fund.** Your offerings may be sent at any time depending on what fits your unit's schedule best. Feel free to combine several months to save checks and postage. Please remember that each unit is required to make a donation to the SWO annually if you would like to have a voting member attend the Fall Gathering.

For offerings going to Churchwide, use **Form B** and send directly to Churchwide. These would include offerings such as Katies Fund and Thankofferings. The Florida Bahamas SWO forwards 55% of all regular offerings we receive from the Units to the Churchwide Organization to support the ministries of WELCA.

Women Boldly Standing for Children

Rachel's Day

Sunday, May 4, 2025

We are approaching two decades of observing Rachel's Day.

Much has been accomplished in building awareness about gun violence. At the same time, it is now legal in all 50 states for qualified individuals to carry guns, and more children are exposed to violence than ever before.

Did you know that every 30 minutes a child or teen dies or is injured from a gun? In 2010, the latest data available, 2,694 children and teens died from guns in the United States— one child or teen every three hours and 15 minutes, seven every day, 51 every week for a year, according to a *Children's Defense Fund report—Protect Children Not Guns*. More than six times as many children and teens—18,270—suffered nonfatal gun injuries as gun deaths in 2010, the report said, and children and teens in America are 17 times more likely to die from gun violence than their peers in other high-income countries.

May we all have our Churches in Florida use Sunday, May 4, 2025, as Rachel's Day to ask God to help us in this desperate situation while taking an offering for an organizations near that help these children.





May Friendship Day dates back to May 1933, when two independent groups planned luncheons to focus on “Child Health” and “Children of Migrant Families.” The first event was sponsored by the Women’s Council for Home Missions in New York City and the second one, called “Dedication Day,” was sponsored by the National Council of Federated Church Women in order to bring the group’s dream of unity into full expression in each local community. Under a variety of names, this event continued and expanded until 1939, when they merged under the National Council of Church Women, which called for an annual observance “to strengthen a growing sense of unity, the joy of Christian fellowship, and the power of Christianity in the day of need.” In May 1945, a few years after the founding of Church Women United, the celebration was formalized as May Fellowship Day. In 1999, the movement of Church Women United changed the name of the celebration to May Friendship Day, as we continue to celebrate unity in our journey toward wholeness in all communities.
